# Road Closures & Car Parking

The procession through the village will commence at 12pm. Road closures will be in effect for a short period before the procession and will be in effect until the procession is concluded and spectators have safely dispersed to the main event location at the Lymm May Queen field off Pepper Street.

The following road closures will be in place on the day from 11.30am until 1.30pm. There will be provision for emergency services vehicles to be escorted through the village, however no other traffic will be permitted through the village during this period.

Please note that times are approximate and therefore closures may be in place slightly earlier and/or later than anticipated.

## Car Parking Facilities

There are no parking facilities on the Lymm May Queen field. However, 3 public pay and display car parks are available within the village.

Please note that access will be restricted during the road closures, so please arrive before 11.30am. Pay & Display charges apply, please see [www.warrington.gov.uk/carparks](http://www.warrington.gov.uk/carparks) for current pricing.

# A bit of May Queen History...

With thanks to Lymm Heritage Centre

Lymm's May Queen is a tradition that stretches back 137 years to 1889. It has been a bumpy ride at times, with event occasionally interrupted by war, financial difficulties and even extreme weather. But much of the ceremony that you will see today, the crowning, the retinue and the parade all date back to those very early days (originally a temperance affair).

Life for our May Queens has changed enormously in that time though and this year in particular we have the chance to reflect on that change as the May Queen of exactly 100 years ago left us not only her crown but her own story originally written for her family.

Winnie Yearsley's account tells of a life that we would see today as one of extreme hardship, child exploitation even, but in her eyes it was clearly a happy childhood with simple pleasures taken between all the hard work.



Winnie was born in a cottage in Broomeedge, one in a row of six that shared a single tap and where the council came once a week to empty the toilets. School was a mile and a half walk away with household chores to be done in the evenings before both parents returned from work. There were special times too. When Easter came the children would take their small baskets and go round to the farms and say "Please good Dame will you please give us an Easter egg". If they were lucky they would receive one egg each, ( that's a hen's egg not a chocolate one! ).

By 1926, aged 14, Winnie was in full time work for a local farmer. Starting at 7am she would set off on her milk round pushing a bicycle with churns of milk hanging on both handlebars, stopping to ladle out her deliveries around the neighbourhood. Only when this was complete would she be able to sit down to a farmhouse breakfast before heading out again to feed the hens, chickens duck and geese.

So for Winnie being crowned May Queen was the experience of a lifetime. She recalled "It meant going all around the village in a coach with six beautiful horses and eight little girls as maids of honour and a big procession. Then I had to be crowned. It was a lovely day and I still have the crown".

Soon after, at age 16, Winnie changed job and went into service. But this turned out to be an even harder life. Starting at 6am she would lay and light the fires before setting table and making a full cooked breakfast, changing into her uniform of blue frock, white apron and cap to serve it. Her working day did not finish till 8pm. Winnie soon realised this work did not suit her and she moved onto the local salt works and a job as a packer.

Winnie eventually married and left the area but her May Queen crown remained proudly on the mantle shelf at her old home. You can see that crown today on permanent display at Lymm Heritage Centre.

On the field we kick off with the crowning of our Queens and Prince in the main arena, followed by a full schedule of free entertainment throughout the day.

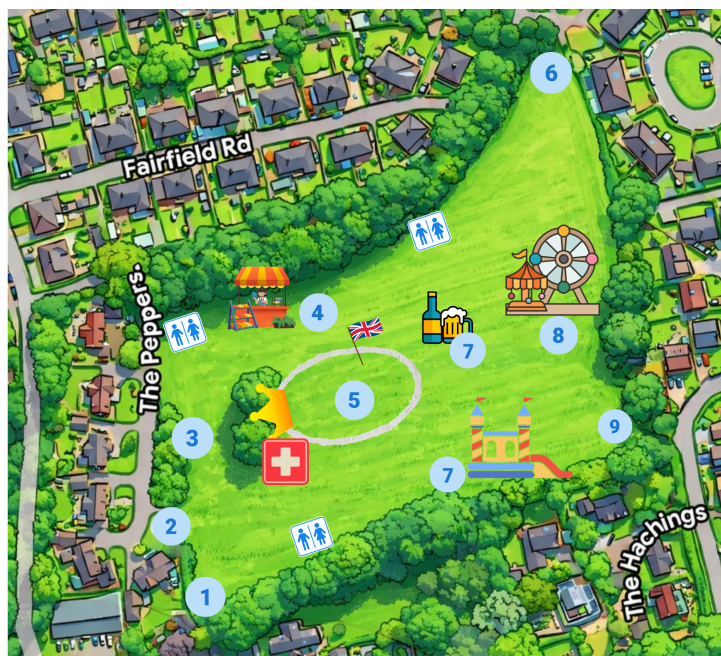
Take a stroll around the field and explore a variety of artisan stalls, alongside local charities, schools, and community groups—perfect for a bit of shopping and supporting local talent.

We can't wait to see you there!

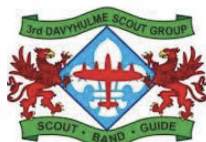
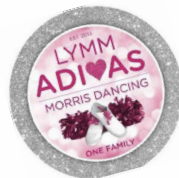

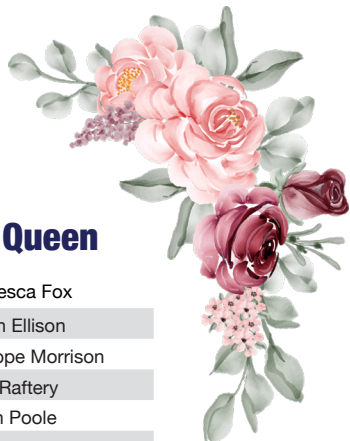
